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Misunderstanding the Queer in Brazilian Theater

In the beggining of XX Century, it was very common to find affeminated men characters in Brazilian Stages, always in comic plays. In the 1960's, appears a more political representation of homossexuality in dramas and performance, in commercial or experimental theater. In the 2000's, the "queer" cathegory has emerged to classify different kinds of expressions, mostly meaning gay or exotic and clownish. "Queer" has been used as a new identity, not as a break of stablished patters of sexuality. This paper aims to review the history of sexuality in Brazilian Theater in order to find keys of understanding of the reception of Queen Theory in theater and performance field and the many misunderstandings that it has caused.
